




Progress Toward Goal

Low-income students and under-represented students of color represent a large portion of the UIA growth in graduates over baseline.




Progress Toward Goal

More than half (about 51%) of the additional UIA graduates over the 2012-13 baseline graduation rates are low-income students. These students were Pell-eligible at the time of admission.
